## A BILL

То	amend section 3319.26 and to enact section 5.281	1
	of the Revised Code to designate the first week	2
	of May as In-Demand Jobs Week and to revise the	3
	training requirements for alternative resident	4
	educator licenses.	5

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3319.26 be amended and section	6
5.281 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 5.281. Beginning in 2018, and every year thereafter,	8
the full week beginning on the first Monday in May is designated	9
as in-demand jobs week.	10
Every year during in-demand jobs week, the governor's	11
office of workforce transformation, in collaboration with the	12
departments of job and family services, education, and higher	13
education, shall organize activities to raise awareness among	14
educators, students, and parents of jobs that are in demand by	15
employers operating in this state and the requirements and	16
benefits of those jobs. The activities shall include job fairs	17
and company tours to connect middle and high school students	18
with employers.	19



Sec. 3319.26. (A) The state board of education shall adopt 20 rules establishing the standards and requirements for obtaining 21 an alternative resident educator license for teaching in grades 22 kindergarten to twelve, or the equivalent, in a designated 23 subject area or in the area of intervention specialist, as 2.4 defined by rule of the state board. The rules shall also include 2.5 the reasons for which an alternative resident educator license 26 may be renewed under division (D) of this section. 27 (B) The superintendent of public instruction and the 28 chancellor of the Ohio board of regents jointly shall develop an 29 intensive pedagogical training institute to provide instruction 30 in the principles and practices of teaching for individuals 31 seeking an alternative resident educator license. The 32 instruction shall cover such topics as student development and 33 learning, pupil assessment procedures, curriculum development, 34 classroom management, and teaching methodology. 3.5 (C) The rules adopted under this section shall require 36 applicants for the alternative resident educator license to 37 satisfy the following conditions prior to issuance of the 38 license, but they shall not require applicants to have completed 39 a major or coursework in the subject area for which application 40 is being made: 41 (1) Hold a minimum of a baccalaureate degree; 42 (2) Successfully complete the pedagogical training 43 institute described in division (B) of this section or a summer 44 the preservice training institute provided to participants of a 45 teacher preparation program that is operated by a nonprofit-46 organization and has been approved by the chancellor. The 47 chancellor shall approve any such program that requires 48

participants to hold a bachelor's degree; have a cumulative

undergraduate grade point average of at least 2.5 out of 4.0, or	50
its equivalent; and successfully complete the program's summer	51
<pre>teacher_training-institute.</pre>	52
(3) Pass an examination in the subject area for which	53
application is being made.	54
(D) An alternative resident educator license shall be	55
valid for four years and shall be renewable for reasons	56
specified by rules adopted by the state board pursuant to	57
division (A) of this section. The state board, on a case-by-case	58
basis, may extend the license's duration as necessary to enable	59
the license holder to complete the Ohio teacher residency	60
program established under section 3319.223 of the Revised Code.	61
(E) The rules shall require the holder of an alternative	62
resident educator license, as a condition of continuing to hold	63
the license, to do all of the following:	64
(1) Participate in the Ohio teacher residency program;	65
(2) Show satisfactory progress in taking and successfully	66
completing one of the following:	67
(a) At least twelve additional semester hours, or the	68
equivalent, of college coursework in the principles and	69
practices of teaching in such topics as student development and	70
learning, pupil assessment procedures, curriculum development,	71
classroom management, and teaching methodology;	72
(b) Professional development provided by a teacher	73
preparation program that has been approved by the chancellor	
under division (C)(2) of this section.	75
(3) Take an assessment of professional knowledge in the	76
second year of teaching under the license.	77

(F) The rules shall provide for the granting of a	78	
professional educator license to a holder of an alternative	79	
resident educator license upon successfully completing all of	80	
the following:		
(1) Four years of teaching under the alternative license;	82	
(2) The additional college coursework or professional	83	
development described in division (E)(2) of this section;		
(3) The assessment of professional knowledge described in	85	
division (E)(3) of this section. The standards for successfully	86	
completing this assessment and the manner of conducting the	87	
assessment shall be the same as for any other individual who is	88	
required to take the assessment pursuant to rules adopted by the		
state board under section 3319.22 of the Revised Code.	90	
(4) The Ohio teacher residency program;	91	
(5) All other requirements for a professional educator	92	
license adopted by the state board under section 3319.22 of the		
Revised Code.	94	
(G) A person who is assigned to teach in this state as a	95	
participant in the teach for America program or who has	96	
completed two years of teaching in another state as a	97	
participant in that program shall be eligible for a license only	98	
under section 3319.227 of the Revised Code and shall not be	99	
eligible for a license under this section.		
Section 2. That existing section 3319.26 of the Revised	101	
Code is hereby repealed.	102
