The Superintendent Search

The Wayne County Schools Career Center is seeking a highly qualified educational leader for the position of Superintendent. Tri-County Educational Service Center is assisting with the search process.

About the Community

The Wayne County Schools Career Center is located in rural northeast Ohio, centrally positioned within Wayne County, which spans 555 square miles. The main campus is in Smithville, with additional educational sites throughout the county. The Career Center employs over 130 full-time staff members and serves more than 850 junior and senior students from 10 public high schools, four private schools, and a significant home-schooled population. With over 2,700 junior and senior students in Wayne County, more than 30 percent of them attend the Career Center.





Leadership Criteria

The Wayne County Schools Career Center Board of Education is seeking applicants who are dedicated to fostering strong, positive relationships between the board and superintendent. The ideal candidate will demonstrate the following qualities and characteristics:

- A strong commitment to integrating technology into learning
- Excellent speaking and listening skills, with the ability to collaborate effectively with the Board of Education, Treasurer, staff, and community
- A dedication to visibility, accessibility, and engagement with all stakeholders to strengthen the school community
- In-depth knowledge of school law, school finance, as well as state and federal academic requirements and related performance goals
- High standards of integrity, ethics, and personal conduct
- A thorough understanding of the changing economic landscape of the communities served by the Career Center, with a focus on providing opportunities for all students to enroll in the school's programs
- Proven ability to establish and maintain business partnerships
- Experienced educational leader skilled in developing, supervising, and supporting teaching and administrative teams; fosters high performance, accountability, and a culture of success for all
- A strong advocate for community involvement, recognizing that active engagement from local businesses, parents, and residents is essential to the success of the schools and student outcomes



In 1967, adult education began in Wooster, the county seat, with practical nursing and machine apprenticeship programs.

In the fall of 1969, the Wayne County Joint Vocational School (WCJVS) opened as one of Ohio's first vocational schools under Governor James Rhodes.

- Adult education was introduced with 34 classes.
- Local educators, tradespeople, managers, and business owners collaborated to align the school's programs with community needs.
- Initially offering 22 trade programs and three academic classes (English, social studies, and history) the school served 490 students in its first year.

In 1984, the school's name was changed to the Wayne County Schools Career Center.

Between 2006 and 2011, the Career Center expanded significantly:

- A Technology Center with four new labs was added.
- The building was renovated, and an Adult Education Building was included.
- An additional building was converted into the Administration Building.

In 2016, a RAMTEC addition was completed, including two new labs for Machining Technologies and Robotics & Automation.

For the 2024-2025 school year, the Career Center will expand further with a new Welding & Fabrication lab and the introduction of a Cybersecurity & Computer Programming pathway.



WCSCC Information

The Career Center is privileged to serve the 116,000+ residents of Wayne County in various capacities, offering 27 high school Career-Tech programs and 7 full-time Adult Education programs to meet the needs of the community. While much attention is often given to services provided to the high school population, significant services are also available to adults, including full-time and part-time career development, general interest courses, ASPIRE classes, and the Adult Diploma program for residents of Wayne and surrounding counties.

The Career Center also offers Workforce Solutions such as cost-effective assessments, training, and customized consulting to local businesses and industries. The doors are always open to the community for events and activities. A core aspect of the Career Center culture is an emphasis on relationships, support, and meaningful experiences. The strong connections with students, school districts, and the community are central to its success.

Several pathways are provided for students to earn college credit while still in high school, including dual enrollment, College Credit Plus, and articulation agreements. Additionally, the WCSCC remains committed to helping students develop essential professional and community leadership skills by offering numerous opportunities to connect and grow.

The Career Center also provides over 10 student clubs and organizations, along with job placement and work-based learning opportunities for senior students seeking "real-world" experience.

- The Career Center's culture has earned national recognition from *Making Schools Work* for its exceptional support programs through Student Services.
- BPA (Business Professionals of America)
 - o Multiple state placers, with several national qualifiers and placers each year (2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2018-2024).
- FCCLA (now Educators Rising)
 - o Consistently strong state placers and national qualifiers (2010-2024), including multiple national qualifiers in 2012, 2014, 2015, and beyond.
- FFA (Future Farmers of America)
 - o Annual state placers, with notable years including 2013 (7 state placers) and 2015 (7 state placers).
 - o National qualifiers in 2012 and 2024.
- SkillsUSA (Career and Student Technical Organization)


